
Graduation






AN UPDATE ON PROGRESS WITH Eucharistic Congress

Our Parish's enthusiasm in Eucharistic Revival continues to amaze!

Our Corpus Christi procession brought out approximately 100 parishioners, led by Deacon Jean; singing was led by Peter Schubart and son, and sidewalk altars were prepared by Carol Queally, all protected by police officers from the 2nd precinct of Suffolk County.

Our hours of Adoration have been expanded from 9:00am through 8:00pm on Thursdays. On Friday, June 30th Serenity Cinema presented Fr. Mike Schmitz's "The Hour that Will Change Your Life," which causes us to look at Jesus in the Eucharist in an enriched understanding of why He is the "hidden God." In the words of the Nocturnal Adoration Society of August 2004: "Verily Thou art a hidden God (Is 45:15-17.) In no other work of divine love are these words so fully verified as in this adorable mystery of the Most Holy Sacrament, where God is entirely hidden. When the Eternal Word took flesh, he hid his divinity, and appeared as a man on earth, but remaining with us in this Sacrament he hides even his humanity, and as remarks St. Bernard, appears only under the form of bread, to show thereby the tenderness of the love which he bears us: 'The divinity is hid, the humanity is hid, the bowels of charity alone appear."
