## MEDJUGORJE: MY EXPERIENCE by Robert McCrindle (Part 2)

#### Robert recently returned from a pilgrimage to the International Youth Festival (Mladifest) held in Medjugorje..

Throughout the week, I was able to grow in my faith, my prayer life, and my devotion to God in ways I could not have imagined. From attending daily Mass, to climbing both Apparition Hill and Cross Mountain twice that week (once even barefoot!) Seeing people from every race and nation all coming together to pray to God, to ask the Blessed Virgin's intercessions us was incredibly powerful. That's another thing – to be able to pray in public and not be judged for it was amazing to me. Here in our secular world, it is weird to pray in public for many reasons, but in Medjugorje, it's normal, which makes it easy to pray. Simply praying there truly helped me feel God's presence.



Medjugorje was filled with many powerful, moving moments. I had attended adoration a previous evening and found it to be a great way to connect with God, however the next night, there was a deliverance. I had never heard or witnessed one before, and I can tell you it's something I never want to hear again. There was a blood-curdling scream from a woman who had a demon trying to exit her body, and I felt massive empathy for her. Hearing the screams was a lot for me to handle. I started to get emotional, trying to focus on the body of Christ to help her. Rosie and Gina noticed, and they turned to comfort me. Gina told me to pray multiple Hail Mary's for the woman. They both helped me realize that everything would be all right, that God's peace and love will overpower any sort of evil and hate in this world. The next night there were more deliverances, but this time I was prepared, and prayed several Hail Mary's to help the souls of these people.

On a return to Apparition Hill. Louis, Erin and I decided to climb, and I chose to go barefoot, making it to the top with Jesus' help. At the summit we planned to do a little bible study, reading the accounts of Christ's Transfiguration on Mount Tabor, which felt appropriate for the setting. As we studied, once again I saw people from every nation gathered together there to pray. It made me want to stay in Medjugorje forever. I remember trying to get that same feeling back when I returned home; the closest was at a Mass on the beach that first Sunday afterwards. Louis and Erin said it would be hard, that perhaps our mission was to return home and share all the fruits of Medjugorje with everyone we knew.

Our final morning brought Sunrise Mass on Cross Mountain which meant arriving super early to get a good spot. We arrived at 2:30am, and there were already crowds waiting to climb. Looking up we saw all the stars shining brightly with the Milky Way right above us! Other than a church, what better place to find God than in the very nature He created. As great as it is to be surrounded by nature, it is so much better when you are with friends. Sunrise came, and we attended one of the greatest Masses in my life. One thing I will always remember is that at the exact moment of receiving Communion, the sun appeared from behind the mountains, the perfect setting to receive Holy Eucharist.

The holiest moment of the day came when we experienced an apparition of the Blessed Virgin. It made me stop being jealous of other people's experiences in life; how many can say they were that close to our Blessed Mother Mary? We experienced her love firsthand, and it was the perfect ending to a most blessed and wonderful pilgrimage.

The gifts I have received from the pilgrimage have been amazing. I found a job after a year of searching. I feel closer to God and truly want to live out His word. I pray the rosary every day, and say grace before meals. I have started to love the Mass, and I have found friends I can truly trust who will not judge me for who I am, autism and all. Most important, I've learned to trust in our God who is good and will give me everything and more that I need. As I've gotten further away from my time in Medjugorje, I've started to struggle with sins returning, but I know God is always there for me; there is no need to fear when trusting in God. The devil may try to make you anxious and afraid, but God will protect and love you, and eventually you can join Him in the Kingdom of Heaven.

And that is why you should go to Medjugorje.



## Liturgical Minister Training-Fall 2023

The Diocese of Rockville Center will offer training in Spanish and English for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors. No walk-ins permitted, all participants must be registered in advance with a letter from their pastor.

**Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion**: Part A - This training is required for **all** those who are beginning as Ministers. This "BASIC" training is required for **all** Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One **must** attend Part A training prior to Part B training.

A Lector Workshop is available for both new and experienced lectors.
