# THE PASTOR'S DESK A MESSAGE FROM FATHER PETER

### Advent

We now enter the season of Advent, which has its own special place in the Liturgical Calendar. It is more than the lead-up to Christmas, and we should savor the anticipation, the waiting, as Mary and Joseph waited for her child to be born, as we wait for the Savior of the World. We can feel the Spirit in the air surrounding these next four weeks, as we watch each candle being lit on the Advent wreath. Yes, the decorations are up, trees are being trimmed and the continuous shopping trips and online orders crowd the calendar. But we await more than the presents, the music, the food of the season.

We long for Jesus to come among us once more and fill us, his creatures, with peace, joy, and freedom. Jesus' "Advents" for us come three times; first, as a baby that first Christmas over 2,000 years ago in Israel. Second, his birth coming into our hearts right in the here and now, and third, his coming as King at the end of our age, the End of Time. It is easier to reflect on Jesus coming to Bethlehem of Judea, so we start there. That's fine, just so our longing extends to his two other comings as well! "Come, Lord Jesus." The battle for souls is fierce, but victory is assured in the birth of our Savior and King.




The handicrafts trade evolved as a cultural tradition of Christians in the Holy Land for many centuries. This indigenous form of art has since become an industry of great importance to the local people of the region who rely on it for their livelihood. It also holds significance for Christian pilgrims from all around the world whose journeys to the Holy Land can be memorialized for a lifetime in cherished olive wood or mother of pearl souvenirs. The olive wood carving market is the major source of income for the Bethlehem area. More than 65% of the income of the community in Bethlehem comes from this work.

However, in recent years the holy crafts trade has suffered many hardships due to social and economic pressures. The result has been a sharp fall in tourism and diminishing numbers of craftsmen who leave

their traditional trade and emigrate on account of the difficult conditions in their homeland – the Holy Land handicraft market is facing serious danger, as is the Christian community in the region. Sixty five years ago, Christians represented more than 28% of the total population in the Holy Land; today, they account for less than 1.5% of the residents. The loss of Christian people in the land of Christianity's birth represents a tragedy of immeasurable proportions for the billions of Christians worldwide.

Representatives of the craftspeople from the Holy Land will be in the vestibule of St. Francis of Assisi Church the weekend of December 2-3. Thank you for your vital support for a Christian tradition and in protecting this very important culture and industry.




Posters submitted for the contest must have an entry form attached. Contest rules, including size information, can be found on the reverse of the form; parental signatures are required.
